2127. CHANGE ORDER #013 FOR THE EXPLORER ACADEMY- GEIGER BROTHERS

The Superintendent recommends approval of change order #013 for a credit of (\$31,200.00) for the Explorer Academy Project with Geiger Brothers. The purpose of this change order is to provide a credit for the difference in actual installed quantities versus unit price base bid quantities for the following:

2128. CHANGE ORDER #014 FOR THE EXPLORER ACADEMY – GEIGER BROTHERS

2132. APPROVAL OF NEW CAREER LITERACY COURSE AT THE MIDDLE SCHOOLS

The Superintendent recommends the Board approve a proposed middle school course which will incorporate the ELA standards, Career Readiness, technology, and investigating the 16 Career Clusters to provide middle school students a better understanding of CTE options for high school and potential careers.

2133. APPROVAL OF NEW GEOSPATIAL INFORMATION SYSTEMS COURSE FOR HUNTINGTON HIGH SCHOOL

The Superintendent recommends the Board approve a proposed Geospatial Information Systems course for Huntington High School. It is in dual credit process. The course introduces fundamental concepts of geospatial analysis and map interpretation. Technologies include geographic information systems (GIS), global positioning systems (GPS), cartography, remote sensing, geovisualization and interpretation, Internet mapping, and spatial statistics. Explores how geospatial technologies and tools are used in data collection, analysis, presentation, and problem solving.
